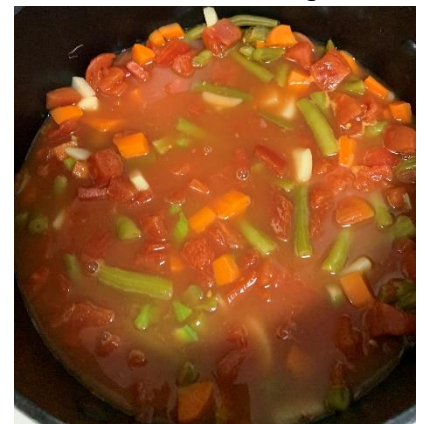
Thank you, Ms. Karen, for helping us learn our lessons about Jesus.

Thank you for your continued non-perishable food donations that support our food ministries to the CYWA and to It Takes a Village’s community food box.

Donations to the food distribution at the CYWA can be placed in the brown wicker basket in the front entranceway at the bottom of the stairs. Donations to the community food box may be placed in the box at any time.

What is “It Takes a Village”? It is their mission to “Be the Village” for those within our community. It Takes a Village maintains ten food boxes, also called “blessing boxes” along the Business 30 corridor between Downingtown and Coatesville. The boxes are unlocked and can be either stocked or shopped from at any time, by anyone, for any reason. These blessing boxes can be a great resource to the homeless, folks currently down on their luck or hungry school students. Locations in our area include:

- Coatesville’s Abdala Park at 9th and 10th Avenues.
- Coatesville’s Ash Park between 3rd and 4th Avenues

- Downingtown at Ebenezer Baptist Church, 199 Wallace Avenue
- Downingtown at the train station
- Honey Brook at Hearts and Hands Community Center, 1 Lenape Way (Indian Run Community)
- Modena at Borough Hall, 5 Woodland Avenue.
