
Dear TUMC Family of Faith,

We pray for all those who have the power over life and death; that they will choose for all people life, and life in all its fullness.


We pray for those who choose war; that they will remember that you direct your people to turn our swords into ploughshares and seek for peace.



We pray for leaders on the world stage; that they are inspired by the wisdom and courage of Christ. Above all, Lord, today we pray for peace for Ukraine.


And we ask this in the name of your blessed Son. Lord have mercy. Amen.








Easter Egg-stravaganza Update

We were able to deliver 69 pairs of gloves, 79 hats, and 14 scarves for the Caln children. You were declared to be, "Awesome as always!" A special thank you to the two angels in our midst who knitted over 50 hats, many with matching scarves and gloves. Your love for the children and your Lord is evident in your work.

PSSA standardized testing is rapidly approaching. The testing times can be long and the test exhausting. Between testing sessions, the children are provided a snack to help them keep up their energy and better concentrate on their work.

Our collection for March will be individually wrapped single – serve snack packages for use during PSSA testing. Boxes of individually wrapped packages of pretzels or goldfish are suggested. Nothing with peanut butter, nuts, or nut products, please.

If you are able to donate in March, the collection bin will be inside the door each weekday from 9:00-2:00 to receive your donations. It will be in its usual location at the top of the stairs on Sundays.
