

APRIL/MAY DONATIONS FOR CALN SCHOOL

Thank you for your amazing support of our March collection. **A total of 803 individual snacks were provided.** I know first-hand that the children do not look forward to standardized testing (neither do their teachers!). They do, however, enjoy the snack time which follows. Your generous donations will allow them to look forward to that break.

Our April/May collection will be books for summer reading. Studies indicate that students who do not read, or read infrequently, during their summer vacation see their reading abilities stagnate or decline. Children who read four or more books over the summer fare better on reading comprehension tests in the fall than their peers who have not read over the summer.

To help the children at Caln keep their reading skills sharp, we will be collecting new or gently used children's books for our April/May donation. Any book suitable for an elementary age child is acceptable, however, because it is a public school, we cannot include religious stories. If you need suggestions, a book list can be found at the end of this newsletter. Copies can also be picked up from the Welcome Center on Sunday mornings or in the office during the week. Books are due Sunday, May 15. Note that this collection does not run until the end of May. The early cut-off date will allow the teachers time to sort and select books for each child.

If you are able to donate for the April/May collection, the bin will be inside the door each weekday from 9:00-2:00 to receive your donations. It will be in its usual location at the top of the stairs on Sundays.

This will be our last collection for this school year. Thank you for your continued support and prayers for this ministry.

Team 3 delivered two meals to the residents of the Atkinson Men's Homeless Shelter in Coatesville.

The first – hot and ready to eat – was Lasagna, Pasta with Sausage, Tossed Salad (enough made for a second meal), Dressings, Home-baked dinner rolls, Butter and assorted desserts that included Blueberry Cake, Vanilla Pound Cake, and Blond Brownies. Beverages were regular and diet Iced Tea and Water.

Another anonymous donor gave money for the second homemade meal (to be heated for a later date). This meal was Shredded beef in gravy over diced potatoes, creamed yellow beans with desserts of Individual Jell-O Pudding Cups, and a layer pie of Cream Cheese and Chocolate and Vanilla Pudding. Drinks were a varied of sodas.
