



YOU. Together we collected 157 pounds of food over this past month to CYWA who distributes to those in need in our community. CYWA can always use the following for their food distribution: Spaghetti Sauce flavored with Meat, Peanut Butter, tuna, or any other non-perishable protein item. Items can be placed in the brown basket located inside the front door.

Chester County Food Beds

The planting season is pretty much over, but the harvesting season will continue until after the hard frost because Martha Champlain and her friend have a passion for feeding those in need. The six planting beds near the playground have been cared for all spring, summer, and fall by these two dedicated women; and it has been a hot, dry summer, requiring watering every other day at the minimum. The seeds and seedlings are provided by the Chester County Food Bank, and the harvest is delivered to City Gate shelter in Coatesville by them.

It is a labor of love that is one more part of TUMC's food program which includes the food box, the food collection for CYWA, and the dinner program at the Atkinson Shelter. It is perhaps the one part of the food program about which few people know, although Big Backyard provided an opportunity for the children to learn about the gardens. Anyone who enjoys gardening might consider joining in the

care of the beds next season, especially with watering. There is a rain barrel that makes watering

easier than it had been since previously the water had to be carried from the stream. More hands make the work lighter.

- 4. Review and submit your gift by clicking "submit."



When we arrived at church, we received an envelope with a card and two \$50 Giant gift cards. The card was unsigned, so





Mental Health FIRST AID


